

# BES PTA General Meeting Minutes September 13th, 2022

- I. Call to Order and Welcome Dawn Baynham, President
  Ms. Baynham called the meeting to order at 6:35pm and welcomed everyone to the first general
  PTA meeting of the 2022-2023 school year.
- II. Establish Quorum Renee Sobota, SecretaryMs. Sobota established quorum.
- III. State of BES Summer Rogers, Principal

Principal Rogers began her presentation by reminding everyone that parents are partners and we need to work together for the success of our kids. She shared with parents that the theme for this to motivate the work we do is "Cracking the Code to Unlock Success at BES." Our teachers are the key to helping your child unlock their success. Principal Rogers then shared that vision and mission statements for BES, which drives everything, the staff does for each of our kids. She shared that we are a Leader in Me school, the only one in CMS. Leader in Me began at BES for the 2020-2021 school year and we were the first school in North Carolina to be a LiM school. The next year, 2021-2022 (year 2 for LiM at BES) focused on math WIGs, leadership roles for students and creating class mission statements. This is year 3 for Leader in Me at BES and students are creating leadership portfolios.

Principal Rogers then shared snapshots of where we were and where we are now academically with the following information.

Growth for students was exceeded. Schools are graded on student growth and our school is at one of the highest growth level you can be. In our south zone, we exceeded all other schools in our zone.

#### Where we are:

We currently have 930 students enrolled at BES and 88 staff members. Additionally, our daily average daily attendance rate is 93.8%. This year, students will have specials every other day which allows for more planning time for teachers to create personalized instructional plans for each student. When students don't have specials, they have WIN time (what I need), which is additional time for their teacher to support them.

2022-2023 BES key goals focus on three main areas: Culture, Academics and Leadership. Also, teachers are continuing their work on growing themselves to better support each of their students.
